Leading social change is hard work. It requires vision, leadership skills and an entrepreneurial mindset. The Kroc School's Master of Arts in Social Innovation (MASI) will prepare you to look critically at the roots of social problems and create sustainable change in a wide variety of organizational settings. Through a cross-disciplinary curriculum, students graduate to have purpose-driven careers, prepared to design and implement innovative solutions that tackle a wide range of urgent challenges such as poverty, climate change and inequality.

The MASI program offers students the opportunity to practice social innovation by engaging with leaders and organizations in the San Diego-Tijuana region and through other international field courses. The learning experience in the field is paired with courses geared toward an understanding of design thinking, collaborative problem-solving and business models. Being housed in a peace school, the MASI program gives students an edge by integrating expertise in peacebuilding with business, entrepreneurship and leadership.

The 30-unit MASI program can be completed in nine months (full-time). Flexible, part-time options are also available. Students take diverse courses from world-class scholars and practitioners from the Kroc School, USD School of Business, School of Education and Leadership Sciences and the College of Arts and Sciences. The MASI program also provides transformative co-curricular opportunities for learning by doing — for example, through participation in the Fowler Global Social Innovation Challenge, students can turn their own projects into a real-world venture and compete for up to \$50,000 in seed funding.
